From the Presidents Shed.

Hello all,

Being rained off today, I actually found some time to sit in front of the computer and write this. Last year's crop of birds are coming along, nothing marvellous in my opinion, still, who knows what they might be like come show day!

Speaking of which, I hope to see as many of you as possible at Harden, having missed the Orp show last year.



The social aspect of our shows is very important, a real feature of our club. So, don't miss it!

I have decided to do a little piece on some of our leading breeders each Outlook, I think it can benefit all of us to get to know them, as well as find out what they do to ensure continued success.

First cab off the rank is our King of Orpington bantams, Bluey Callinan. Bluey writes:

'I bred Blue and Black Orpington Large for a few years having reasonable success when at Wellington at the Orpington club show I was smitten by the beauty of the Black Orpington Bantams there to be auctioned. They were all that remained of the fowls from the estate of Mr Jim Wykes; sadly he had passed away. I resisted buying a pair and went home thinking about these little beauties. Orpington bantams were starting to turn heads in shows and I thought that the age of bantams was appearing, so I decided to breed some myself.


I had a very sweet little Blue hen that was too small for exhibition and I needed a male to suit. Graham Findlay gave me a Black cockerel that had profuse feather and a smaller than usual body, so my breeding began. My first chicks were just a bit too big but they were wonderful in type so I kept on breeding to reduce size. I eventually had the size right but the wings were too large and the cockerels crowed like large fowls. I had to add bantam genes. I had an old mate with Australorp bantams and I visited his yard and to my surprise I found a cockerel that was Orpington shaped. I went home with this bird and bred chickens to be happily surprised with all the things I was trying to achieve. I went on, over the next few years to take out Best Bird of Show with Blue and Black bantams.

Rob Lavender was at this time working on Buff Orpington bantams and in his generous style he shared them around with breeders. I was fortunate to get some and started with Buff Bantams. They went well and after a few years I had a major win with them as well.

A major health problem arrived and I made a decision to get rid of my fowls. I sent my Buffs to Melbourne and the Blacks and Whites were re-housed locally. After a year, I was recovering and missing my fowls. My nephew purchased a Buff cockerel bred by Stan Bell in WA as a present for me and I managed to locate a suitable hen, so I was up and running again. I went on to breed Buffs for a few years before deciding to breed Whites. That was a challenge. I have bred Whites for some years now and have them developed to show standard. A major win with the Whites at the Orp Show still evades me but I have been close a few times. I have also started working on a strain of Lavender bantams; that should keep me busy. What is life without a challenge! Bluey Callinan.

What a beaut story Bluey! I know one thing that stands out for me from the foregoing, that is, persistence pays and never give up!

That's all for now but as always if you need to ask anything or let me know how your birds are going email, FB message or call me – always happy to chat and spread the word about our favourite Poultry breed!



BOOK REVIEW

ORPINGTONS – THE PAST, THE PRESENT, THE FUTURE By Dallas J Smith

Dallas Smith is well known for the high standard achieved in the numerous poultry publications he has been associated with, like *Simply Wyandottes*. The release of *Orpingtons* will not disappoint. Although written for devotees of this breed, much in the text will interest breeders of other fowl who are struggling with the intricacies of colour.

Orpingtons details the development of the breed and the numerous stakeholders involved. New insights are presented as the author has thoroughly researched the breed's origination. A subsequent section builds on this historical background, examining each colour variety closely and unravelling its particular story and the individuals involved.

One of the valuable features of the book is that it presents a global perspective of Orpingtons with input and photos on the various colour varieties from master breeders from the UK, USA, Denmark, South Africa, Australia and more.

Several parts of the book deserve highlighting. The first is the section titled 'What the Standards do not say'. Several pages are devoted to discussion on points of the standard, enabling a clearer understanding to be achieved. The second section forms part of the colour discussion that accompanies each of the 16 recognised varieties and contains valuable advice on achieving the correct shade or pattern. For example, the examination of both white and blue plumage were valuable as was coverage on some less common Orpington colours.


Separate chapters detailing colour requirements, the breed standards, judging and care and management offer constructive information and advice.

The illustrations in *Orpingtons* are a key feature with some 200 coloured and black and white photos plus a number of prints. Examining and comparing the photos enables the small differences that exist between examples in different countries to be appreciated and adds to the understanding


pared for some great photos of Orpington varieties that are not seen in Australia.

This book is a good investment for collectors and a top read for admirers of the breed that haven't read the antiquarian books by William Cook or Lewis Wright. An excellent mix of history and practical information that will guide breeders to greater success.

SHOW REGULATIONS.

- 1. This Show will be conducted under the Rules of The Orpington Club of Australia and the Model Rules of The E.P.A of NSW. Copies of these rules may be perused at the Show Secretary's Desk.
- 2. Entries will be accepted <u>only</u> from Members of The Orpington Club of Australia. New and Renewing Members may pay their subs. along with their Entry Fees.
- 3. Judging will be carried out in accordance with the Standards appearing in "The Australian Poultry Standards 2nd edition", <u>AND</u> those adopted by The Orpington Club of Australia.
- 4. The Judge's decision will be final in all matters regarding merit, and eligibility.
- 5. Judging will be "open", but onlookers are asked to maintain a respectful distance from the Judges and Stewards. An associate Judge may be appointed to handle certain classes if deemed necessary after entries have closed.
- **6.** Perpetual Trophies are retained by the winners until the next National Orpington Show when they are to be returned for further competition.
- 7. <u>Penning of Birds</u> may take place from 5 p.m till <u>7p.m.</u> on Friday June 23rd (<u>pavilion closes at 7pm</u>) and from 7 a.m till 8.30 a.m. on Saturday. Judging commences at 9.00 a.m <u>sharp.</u> Please note on your entry form if you intend penning on Friday night <u>before 7pm</u>.
- 8. <u>Unpenning of Birds</u> may take place immediately following the Awards Presentation. <u>No exhibit may be removed</u> without supervision from the Show Manager or their delegate .This will be rigidly enforced!!!!
- 9. NOTE! Single birds from Breeding Pairs, and varieties other than Black, Blue, Buff, White, Cuckoo or Splash are NOT eligible for the Best Bird in Show Award.
- 10. Where four (4) or more entries are received for a non- classified (AORC) variety, a separate class/ classes will be provided for that variety. Please ensure that variety details are completed on the entry form.
- 11. Entries for the W&W Colours Classes (057 Large Male. 058 Large Female, 059 Bantam Male,060 Bantam Female) are only eligible if they are not a Standard or recognised APS colour. Judging process will be explained via the Orpington Outlook and on show day

The pavilion may be open on the Sunday morning for removal of birds, upon arrangement with the HPC and the Show Manager.
