From The Secretary's Desk

Greetings to all Orpingtonians,

Well, was that a Show or wasn't it? Our Fifth National Orpington Show far exceeded all expectations with the massive entry of 373 Orpingtons easily outstripping the previous best at Albury in 2005. The response should be seen as a great tribute to our Judge, Robert Hunt, a long time Member and Orpington breeder who last judged our Club Show at Goulburn way back in the 1990's. Early indications were suggesting that we were in for a very good entry, and as the nominations steamed past the 250 mark with a fortnight to go, the Club Committee was faced with a decision. Realizing that one man could not be expected to do justice to the projected entry, we decided to call in Kim George, a very experienced Softfeather Judge, who was already scheduled to pass judgement upon the Brahmas and Cochins at the same Queanbeyan venue on the same day. So, the decision was made. Robert would handle all the Blacks, Buffs and Blues in both Large Fowl and Bantams. Kim would judge the classes only, in the rest of the varieties, with Robert deciding the Champions in those colours. This of course meant that Robert could then consider those birds for the overall Champion Awards. This procedure was somewhat of a " first", but it seemed to work very well. And it allowed us to have the winning birds photographed early, rather than leaving that important task till the last minute. The judging was finished early, leaving plenty of time for the important business at the end of the day. The whole day seemed to run very smoothly with many people commenting on how quickly the cards went up, and how good it was to see the Champion rosettes on to the winning birds very shortly after the awards had been decided. I would like to thank everyone concerned for their sterling efforts, with particular mention to Tony Standing and Cathy Pobje for their tireless efforts in getting the awards onto the pens. Martin Doulton was, as usual, a tower of strength behind the scenes, and our Stewards, Jayne Stannard and Simon Beven did a great job keeping the judging moving at the necessary speed. * Please allow me to extend the Club's grateful thanks to the Committee of The Canberra Queanbeyan Poultry Club for hosting our Show in such brilliant fashion. I must say that the co-operation and support that we received was absolutely outstanding, and it is easy see why this Club is regarded as one of the most progressive in N.S.W. The President, Greg Davies was on the go all weekend, and he is also

responsible for many of the pictures of the winning birds in this issue. The Secretary, Terry Turner, and the willing workers in the Canteen all certainly helped make the Show a memorable one. Here, I would like to give a special thanks to Peter Shands, the Treasurer of the host Club and a good friend of ours. His assistance has been absolutely outstanding right from when we first started considering Queanbeyan as a venue for the Show. I was blown away when Peter (a high powered businessman, and no doubt with plenty to attend to on a Friday) was first on the scene at the pavilions, diligently helping me to put the pen tickets on the cages to ensure that early comers would be able to pen their birds straight away. Little things like that are not forgotten in my book.

So, well done Queanbeyan! Our next National Show will not be held until 2013, but I doubt if we can come up with a better venue. One that is reasonably accessible to all, and therefore fair to the majority of our Members.

*Our Saturday night function was held at one of the local Clubs, and provided a very pleasant finale to what had been a thoroughly enjoyable day. About 40 people from our Club were joined by our Judges and Mr and Mrs Greg Davies as our guests for the evening. The Club Committee decided that, in view of the record entry, we should give a bit back to our exhibitors by hiring a private function room for our dinner (complete with a drink waiter!) All voted the evening a great success.

- I would like to record my thanks also to Sue Barker, Judy Witney, and Robert Callinan for their photographic work included in this issue.
- Our Show provided some memorable highlights and, although readers will understand that I personally, did not get much of a chance to view the birds, I will list some of my recollections.
- 1. The 42 Standard Black pullets with the Stannards taking six of the top seven awards. Extraordinary!
- 2. The 37 Standard Buff pullets with the Crookwell maestro, Simon Beven standing 1 and 2.
- 3. Sonya Ford's Standard Blue cockerel. I did not see him till just before judging started, but he had me rushing back to my books to see who owned him.
- 4. Martin (Waninga) Doulton's Standard White cock. Had the flashing red light on him the moment I saw him. The best White we have seen in the East for many, many years.
- 5. Sue (The Cuckoo Breeder) Barker's Crele Legbar-type cockerel. Great example of a new colour.
- 6. The 100- plus Bantams which was easily a record for our Show. Quality high and awards spread around.
- 7. The World's youngest Champion Orpington exhibitor, Rose Gibson, decked out in Western gear and receiving her trophies from Rob Callinan.

*Must give a special vote of thanks to our Member, Mick Dubbeld from Victoria. Most will recall that Mick very kindly donated a Maremma puppy to assist Club funds. The puppy sold for \$300, and the proceeds will be a great boost to our Club coffers. Great gesture Mick!

Thanks are also due to those two livewires from Victoria– Sue Barker and Jenny Stewart. Always coming up with ways to promote our Club and the breed, the girls had their latest initiatives on display at the National. Jenny has had some very attractive fridge magnets made (depicting the various Orpington colours) and these proved a most interesting, and popular, addition to our merchandise table. Sue Barker has produced a very striking cloth fabric patch suitable for sewing on to jackets and caps. We have a limited number of these available right now, and details can be seen on page 12 of this issue. Thank you ladies– every little bit helps.

* Our raffle proved a wonderful success this year, thanks to the ticket sellers and to all those people who donated prizes. The two top prizes were the books donated by Jenny Stewart, and let me tell you, I could have sold them a dozen times over! First Prize (The Orpington Fowl book, by Will Burdett and Dr. Batty) was won by Lester Flint from W.A. with a ticket returned from the last Newsletter. I did not advise Lester, so I hope the postman brought him a nice surprise. The Second Prize (the Grant Brereton book) was scored by one of our newer Members– John Bowman. Many thanks to Pam Callinan, Simon Beven, Chris Hardman, the Keirls, Ross Gibson and Laucke Stockfoods for their kind donations. Since our last Newsletter, we have had another influx of new Members, including four who joined up at the Show. Our Club bids you all a hearty welcome, and we hope your involvement with our wonderful breed is a long and fulfilling one. We are all here to assist you in any way possible.

With the highlight, and main showing part of the season now over, this will be our last Newsletter for a while, so I bid you all a good breeding season and pleasurable times with your Orpingtons-



Fowl Business



Annual General Meeting 9/7/2011- Queanbeyan

President, Robert Callinan in the Chair- 28 Members present <u>Apologies-</u> Rob Lavender, Rob Stanley, Wayne Robinson, Yvonne Mack Accepted on the Motion of Sue Barker, Seconded M.Doulton- Carried President's Report-

Robert Callinan delivered his Report verbally, thanking the Members for their attendance, and congratulating all concerned in staging such an outstanding Orpington Show. He made strong mention of the way that the Club had been hosted by The Canberra Queanbeyan Poultry Club, stating that the venue and support was ideal and that he felt we were certain to return to Queanbeyan again. Robert said that he was greatly pleased by the continued improvements in our Orpingtons, particularly in some of the worrying aspects of the breed in previous years. He felt that the Club Executive continued to work well together, and he hoped that the Club would continue it's strong progress. President's Report accepted on the Motion of Simon Beven, Seconded Sonya Ford and Carried. Secretary's Report.

Dallas Smith read from a prepared report, a copy of which was tabled and attached. Mentioned was the imperative that a Show Secretary be elected, at least for the ensuing year.

Carried on the Motion of Sue Barker, Seconded by Judy Witney.

Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer presented a Balance Sheet dated 31st May 2011. A copy was tabled and attached. Due to our AGM falling so close to the end of the Financial Year, no further Bank Statements were available. A projected figure, setting out all Receipts and Expenditure for the June period was presented, taking into account all expected transactions. This was accepted on the Motion of Dallas Smith and Seconded by Terry Trengrove. Carried.

All Positions Then Declared Vacant.

A submission from the floor suggested that, if agreed to, all Office Bearers to be re-elected "en bloc" The Secretary reminded the Meeting that he felt that, of prime importance was the election of a Show Secretary, particularly in regard to the Canberra National Poultry Show 2012. He also added that Jenny Stewart should be nominated to fill an extra position on the Southern Committee.

On the Motion of Judy Witney, Martin Doulton was elected as Show Secretary for 2012, and Jenny Stewart was added to the Southern Committee. All other Officers to be returned unopposed. Seconded by Sue Barker and Carried. The President resumed the Chair.

General Business

Motion- That Membership Fees, Entry Fees remain as is and Registration Fees to be paid.

Moved- Simon Beven- Seconded Colin Tiyce and Carried

Regarding Notice of Motion from D.Smith.

To be accepted with the following amendments-

That a sum of \$500 be allocated to each of the Southern and Northern Committees to stage their Shows in 2012,2016,2020 etc. Said Committees will have full responsibility in allocating all prizes, expenses including Shed hire, judge etc. Committees to augment their Schedules as they see fit.

That a sum of \$1000 be used to subsidise the Annual Show of The Orpington Club of Australia. This to be subject to review as needed.

That a sum of <u>\$400</u> be contributed towards the Orpington sections at the Canberra National Poultry Show 2012 to be allocated to include Cash Awards and Rosettes for Champion and Reserve Champ Standard Orpington with the same in Bantams. Rosette or sash to the best of each Classified variety in both Large Fowl and Bantam. Club Committee to nominate appropriate breakup. Our Club to nominate our Judge preferences from those who could be expected to attend the Show at <u>their own expense</u>. These preferences to be decided at the AGM in the previous year.

We have again strengthened our links with our overseas Orpington friends, and it is safe to say that our Club has established a prominent part on the stage of the International Orpington fraternity.


