From the Presidents Shed

G'day All,

Some of you may have meet me but many of you in the new virtual world will not have so a small introduction is pertinent at this point in time.

I am better known with my exploits with standard black leghorns over the last 30 odd years. But my involvement with Black Orpingtons came though my Grandmother who had Standard Orpingtons running around the farm at Wingham NSW, back in the 1970's. I was only a small boy back then but most farms had poultry as the egg quota system was still in



place and many small mixed farms had egg production as one of their income streams. Anyway after Grandmother passed on, the Orpingtons were just kept and I developed an interest in poultry. I dabbled in Pekin Bantams, but the biggest investment of my young life (14) at that time was \$45 in a trio of Black Leghorns, I still remember them arriving on the train from Sydney. My father never a poultry man, was disgusted I would waste so much money on a hobby. He still maintains today that the black leghorns don't lay enough for what they initially cost, back in 1982. From here I pursued my career with Leghorns, and the Orpingtons mostly stayed at home.

It was not until our daughter Rose turned up under a cabbage one cold morning in 2008 that my father (the non poultryman) said, "Your grandmother would like to have seen those Orpingtons shown under Roses name". I was a little surprised that he would come up with such a scheme, but anyway this reignited the family's commitment to the Orpington breed. So much so that in 2010 mum and Dad (the first poultry show dad ever went too), drove all the way to Moruya to show a small team of Black Orpingtons at the Orpington National under Rose's name. For a 2 year old she did quite well taking out bird of show.

The next year we backed up, but Rose as a 3 year old made the trip with me all the way to Queanbeyan, from Inverell northern NSW (yes a few nappy stops). This was the most memorable show day of my life, here writing this article I can't quite put it into words. But for me it was a day that reinvigorated my faith in fellow man. On a lighter note I am internally grateful to Nurse Ford for saving Rose from an overdose of Panadol.

That day made me realise what the Orpington club has come to represent.

- People who are interested in preserving something good, the Orpington fowl.
- Fierce but friendly sportsmanlike competitiveness.
- A sense of community and belonging with an ability to welcome new comers into the fold.
- A respect for tradition and knowledge gained through experience and the school of hard knocks.
- An organisation were men and women can work, achieve and play as EQUALS.
- A willingness to change with the times EVOLVE...
- A vehicle to have FUN

The sole reason that I have taken on the role of President is that I would like to do everything in my power to help protect and further develop the seven key factors which I believe are the essence of the Orpington Club of Australia.

As such, the first factor that I believe needs to be addressed is preservation. Over the last 12 months the club executive has been attempting to come up with a way to help educate new Orpington breeders as to what makes an Orpington. What has been agreed by the executive is that under the watchful eye of breed doyen Dallas Smith, we commission an artist to paint two pictures of the perfect Orpington Male and female. It is proposed that these pictures will them be used in our standards and also in our social media efforts so that there is no doubt in any one's mind what makes a good Orpington. With the ever increasing influence of social media on peoples education, the club needs to take an active role here so that people can compare randomly posted photos of Orpingtons "that may make claims as to their merits" and then have something that they can compare them against. There is a degree of urgency here as there is a proposed 3rd edition of the Australian Poultry Standards going to print early next year. We will keep all members advised of developments here.



From the Secretary's desk.

This edition's report is all about the success that was the 2018 National Orpington Show! Probably one of the best- if not the best- Club Show I have had the pleasure and privilege of attending. This was in no small part to the wonderful crew of Club members, Dubbo Poultry Club members and others- all volunteers- who made sure that everything worked so well. They know who they are – On behalf of the Club and its members; THANK YOU for your mighty effort!



The Club took on quite a big agenda for this show. It stemmed from the discussion that took place at the 2017 National when it was generally agreed that to stay as where we were was going backwards and that we as a Club needed to be a bit bolder with our activities if we were too position the breed where it should be and to do our duty as current custodians of the breed and the Club.

So over the year the Clubs officer and state reps kept that energy going and with our focus on making the National Orpington Show as good as it could be things started to happen. Judges were locked in early, awards and trophies ordered and received, sponsorships organised and publicity generated.

A week out from the close of entries I thought that we had got a few birds for our judges Grahame and Brendan to sweat over. Like everyone else on the Club Exec I was mightily surprised when Suzanne let us know a week out that we had an entry of 424 Birds benched by 22 members of which 194 were bantams-both modern day entry records here in Australia. Definitely made the judges sweat and in Grahame's case lifting the Standards in and out of the pens really was a physical workout! We had exhibitors and members from WA, SA, VIC, QLD, ACT and NSW.

The quality of the birds was really very high with very few if any pen fillers. The pics of winners —as taken by our official photographer Brendan McGeachie- support that fact. Some of the big classes took some working through and every bird that won did so against some stiff competition. Generally most birds still needed to finish off. The eventual Bird in Show a Black Bantam Cockerel of Chris Hardman and the Runner up the Champion Standard Large Blue Pullet of Dennis and Jayne Stannard were standout bird's. Congratulations to both exhibitors for such well-deserved accolades but also to all the exhibitors that made this show such a standout.

However it wasn't just the physical showing of the birds that made the long trek to Dubbo all the more worthwhile.

The camaraderie of the Orpingtonians when gathered en masse is something to savour and the evening socials plus the friendly banter around the pens combined with the more experienced members sharing their knowledge freely encapsulated really how friendly the Club is.

The AGM went very smoothly and very quickly- the unconfirmed minutes of which are included in this edition. Congratulations to Ross Gibson for being elected the Clubs President for 2018-19. His first act was to raise a vote of thanks for outgoing President Simon Beven who was with us in spirit. Ross passion for Orpingtons is unbridled and he is on a mission to make sure that the breed standards are kept and improved- read his President article for more on that.

The Club also welcomed a new Patron in one Dallas Smith. Dallas has done so much – and still does in his various sector roles-for the breed over many years. As the author of two seminal books on the Orpington, as State Rep on the Australian poultry Standards Review Committee and as a long time Club Secretary Dallas is our living legend and what a great honour for the Club to have some one of his stature in this position.

However the highlight for me was the inaugural National Orpington Show auction. When Ross (Gibson) suggested this as an addition to the National Show schedule I had no idea how it would go, how much work it would create and whether anyone would get behind it.

In summary the National Orpington Show auction was an outstanding success. Yes People got behind it. They nominated such a high quality of stock, there were many who bought up big and then the team-Angus, Dennis, Jenny and Megan- who managed and administrated the auction process are to be congratulated. Yes the workload was quite manic at times but many hands made it feel a lot lighter than it could have been

The Auction standard was set early. Only birds entered in the Show could be auctioned and a maximum of 4 birds per exhibitor – with a proviso that where 100% of the auction sale proceeds were donated to the Club didn't count in that 4.

Jenny Stewart put together a super catalogue that any premium livestock sale would have been proud of and its download on social media was massive.

The summary of the Auction can be found in this edition. But to have all 34 birds sell and -thanks to the generosity and high prices paid – the initiative became the biggest single income earner in the Clubs 35 year old history. This event has created a paradigm shift in our thinking about not just what the Club can afford to do but it gives us a confidence of what we should be doing.

The founding fathers of the Club way back in 1985 might not have envisaged what happened here at Dubbo in 2018. However the principles that the Clubs pioneers of Blatch, Bishop and Lavender put in place then still ring true today e.g. that the role of the Club is to Protect ,Preserve and Promote this stately breed and that our culture is based around 'We do Best What we do together'.




